### **FINANCIAL REPORT**

### **MATTERS ARISING FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING**

1. The road between Old Station and the Stanton. Clr Rippin informed councillors that she had seen a report/notice that work had been carried out but that she had been unable to ascertain where when she inspected the road.
2. An email had been received from MCC re the 20 mph speed limit in Wales. There was no further new re double yellow lines and rationalisation of parking outside the local primary school gate or the possibility of a 'Pelican Crossing' on the A465, however.
3. Negotiations were still taking place re a new dog-waste removal contract for Monmouthshire.
4. Councillors thanked Clr Morgan-Evans for his help in purchasing a suitable microphone for tonight's hybrid meeting and for testing the same at the Hall with the Clerk and the Chair some time before the meeting.
5. Councillors thanked Clr Rippin for preparing a letter to send to the resident who had complained about the noise level at Neuadd Llwyd.
6. Councillors (together with County Councillor David Jones) had met with the owners of the Mountain Bike Trail at Great Llwygy Farm and had received reassurances which alleviated their concerns about a possible expansion of the car park (detrimental visual impact on the landscape) and the great amount of stone which seemed to be needed for new bike trails according to the planning application.
